Monthly Bird Walks at Quarry Hill

July 2, August 6, & September 3. Meet at 9 am at the Quarry Hill Nature Center and join us on a casual walk thru the park. Walks usually last about one hour. Free and open to the public - no registration required. Leaders: Terry & Joyce Grier

July 9 - 18th Annual Rochester Butterfly Count

9 am morning session - Meet at Quarry Hill Nature Center 1 pm afternoon session - Meet at Chester Woods* Leader: Joel Dunnette

Participants in this Citizen Science project should have some experience with butterflies, be prepared for the weather, and be able to walk a mile or more on and off trails. Novices will be paired with an experienced team leader. Bring close-focusing binoculars or a digital camera with close-focusing capability. These are key to field identification of butterflies. . **NOTE:** you must register for this event by emailing jdunnette@gmail.com or calling 507-269-7064.

Our local nurseries and growers are a great resource and can help you choose the right plants for your butterfly garden. **Bonus**, native plants also attract birds by providing important food sources such as nectar, berries, and insects.

August 26 - Chimney Swift Sit

Friday, August 26, 2016

7:45 - 9 pm in the St. Pius X Catholic Church parking lot at 1315 12th Ave NW, Rochester, MN 55901 / Led by Sandy Hokanson

Chimney Swifts gather in large number each fall during migration and create fabulous displays when they enter a chimney to roost. Bring a lawn chair and binoculars to watch as (hopefully) hundreds of Chimney Swifts enter the St Pius Chimney to roost. From this location we can also see a chimney roost at the John Marshall High School - so we may observe both locations. Rain date is Saturday, August 27.

Sept. 27 - ZVAS Monthly Meeting - The Minnesota Raptor Center

7 - 8 pm at Quarry Hill Nature Center

You'll be inspired to learn more about Minnesota's raptors when you meet a live owl, hawk, and falcon up close and in person. Our presenter from the Raptor Center will teach us the three key identifying features of all raptors, discuss the positive and negative impact humans have on our environment, and share some of our greatest environmental success stories, such as the Peregrine Falcon and the Bald Eagle.

Oct. 1 - Fall Sparrow Field Trip

7:30 - 9 am - at Kalmar Reservoir / Led by Jerry Pruett and John Hockema

Late September through early October is a great time to look for migrating sparrows. We should see White-crowned, Lincoln's, White-throated, Savannah, Vesper sparrows and with a little luck we may pick up Nelson's Sharp-tailed, LeConte's and Harris's sparrows as well. We'll meet in the parking lot on the east side of the Kalmar Reservoir (East Landfill Reservoir) just off of 19 ST NW and Valleyview CT. about 2 miles west of the Rochester Athletic Club at 7:30 AM. Bring water-proof footwear as the grass will probably be quite wet.
