That is changing as people begin to see how necessary marshes can be. Ms. Timmerman will discuss the history of wetlands, their depletion and the cost to our native plants and animals. She further will discuss what steps we can take in the future to mitigate this damage.

April 18, Thurs - Woodcock Watch - Chester Woods Park, 7:30 PM

Every spring the Woodcock perform one of the strangest and most interesting mating rituals. We will observe it up close just at dusk. Meet near the park entrance or in the horse corral parking lot. Led by Jim Peterson
